## Background:

Rockingham District Partners in Ministry of the United Methodist Church has launched a ministry to repair homes for needy residents of Richmond, Scotland, and Robeson counties in order to demonstrate the love of Jesus Christ to our neighbors. *This ministry is called Rockingham Outreach and Recovery, better known as ROAR.* The organizational format is set, and we are now actively conducting repair work on houses.

The purpose of this letter is to solicit volunteers for our next project, which is described below. One project has already been completed. Our goal is to complete 5 or 6 more homes in 2009 and your help is definitely needed.

## Next Project:
